MOUNT BAKER STATE FFA CONVENTION RESULTS

The Mt. Baker FFA attended the State FFA Convention at Washington State University in Pullman from May 13 to May 17. Thirty-three students competed in various Career Development Events throughout four day convention. The following teams and individuals made the finals at the convention: *Brian Davis* 5th place in Job Interview, Parliamentary Procedure 6th place team, Farm and Business Management won 2nd place with *Brian Davis* placing 2nd in state and *Dan Strachila* placing 5th high individual. Agriculture Communications placed 3rd in state with *Janelle Richner* placing 5th and *Kalyn Larsen* placing 9th. The Food Science team placed 10th. The Mt. Baker FFA scrapbook received 2nd place. Students also competing at state were the Dairy Products team (11th place), Prepared Public Speaking, and First Year Member. *Matthew Cronk* was the Agriculture Mechanics Repair and Maintenance Placement Proficiency Award state winner who received a gold rating and will compete at nationals. *Kurtis Zender* placed 2nd in the same proficiency area. *Maija Haggith* was the state winner in the Dairy Production Entrepreneurship Proficiency Award for the second year in a row. *Kassidy VanBerkum, Matthew Cronk, Maija Haggith, Christine Cadman, and Kurtis Zender* received their State FFA Degree. The Mt. Baker FFA also received 3rd place in the National Chapter Award which recognizes chapter activities throughout the year in student development, community development, and chapter development.
